Student objectives define the mission in terms of measurable student learning. To get an idea of how you can enhance your student objectives, complete the following self-assessment. Next, use your self-assessment data to develop action plans.

For each statement below, circle the appropriate rating. Use the following scale:

- 4 3 2 1 *The student objectives are Christ-centered, promoting the development and application of a Biblical worldview. As a package, your student objectives are true to Christian faith commitments, true to the creation-fall-redemption-restoration motif, and true to the cultural mandate (Genesis 1:26-28), the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20), loving God and neighbor (Matthew 22:37-39), and being part of the Church (Ephesians 4:16).*
- 4 3 2 1 *The student objectives address the whole person. As a package, your student objectives address the spiritual, intellectual, aesthetic, social, emotional, physical, and moral.*
- 4 3 2 1 *The student objectives define the mission in terms of measurable student learning. They are written in terms of what students will do (not what teachers will do) and are measurable using classroom assessments.*
- 4 3 2 1 *Each student objective is based on sound, current research and practice. Each student objective is based on a combination of a Christian philosophy of education and current research, and current practice.*
- 4 3 2 1 *Each student objective is for all students. Each student objective defines what you want all of your students to achieve.*
- 4 3 2 1 *Each student objective is attainable. Your students are able to meet each student objective.*
- 4 3 2 1 *Each student objective is written in student-friendly language. Fourth graders can read, understand, and memorize each student objective.*
- 4 3 2 1 *Each student objective is written in meets-the-standard language.*
- 4 3 2 1 *Each student objective is interdisciplinary. (Subject area standards identify what a student must achieve in a given subject in order to achieve the student objectives.)*
- 4 3 2 1 *Subject-area standards are addressed by the student objectives. Your student objectives serve as macro-curriculum standards.*
